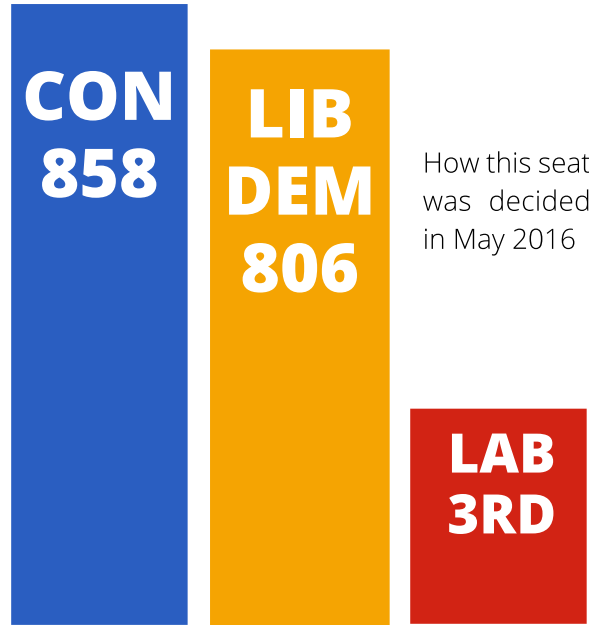

Campaigning to get Lakers reopened

James Sanderson and the Lib Dems are very concerned that Surrey County Council has refused to guarantee that Lakers Youth Centre will be rebuilt, after it was damaged by a fire in January.

The Lib Dems have challenged the Conservative-run Council to confirm that Lakers will reopen, but the Tories have refused to give that assurance. They could 'pocket' any insurance money and close Lakers.

James Sanderson said, "Residents will be really concerned that they could be about to lose a valuable community asset, but the local Lib Dem team and I are committed to campaigning for it to reopen."

Lib Dems campaign on empty homes and the 'Tory Tip Tax'

Over 700 homes in Woking are left empty adding to the housing crisis

Despite homelessness, pressure on the Green Belt and high house prices - 708 homes in Woking are sitting empty. Woking has many more empty homes than neighbouring areas, and the Lib Dems have called for action,

James Sanderson said, "At a time when homelessness is rising, it is a scandal that so many homes locally are sitting empty. Woking Council needs to use its powers to bring more empty homes back into use as soon as possible. Based on the latest numbers, the last time the Council brought an empty home back into use was in September. That is not good enough."



Campaigning against the 'Tory Tip Tax'

James Sanderson and the Lib Dems are campaigning against Surrey County Council's charges on residents disposing of DIY waste, dubbed the 'Tory Tip Tax'. The Government has said Surrey County Council should not be charging residents for disposing of DIY waste, and said they will change the law if Surrey does not change its rules.

The Lib Dems are continuing to challenge Surrey County Council on these waste charges.
