✓ Demand better transport and parking

James Sanderson and the Lib Dems want to freeze car parking charges to attract shoppers and support local businesses. We will seek to find sites for "Park and Ride" or "Park and Stride". We will work with the County Council to try to get more local and cheaper bus services. We will make cycle parking safer with better lighting and more CCTV.

✓ Homes to meet local needs

James Sanderson and the Lib Dems will update planning guidance so 15 storeys is the maximum future height new buildings can be built in the town centre, with much lower building heights in our villages and communities. We will provide the homes that people need by providing 102 affordable homes each year.

Voters are getting behind Lib Dem James Sanderson as the only chance to stop the Conservatives in Goldsworth Park and Woking.

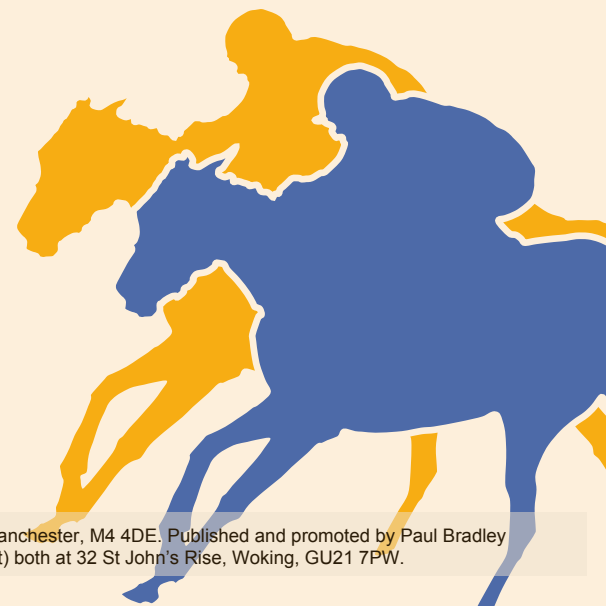

Lakers Youth Centre - closed for 1 year!

Conservative-run Surrey County Council has stated they have no immediate plans to reopen Lakers Youth Centre one year after it was badly damaged and closed by a fire.

James Sanderson said, "The Lib Dems and I have criticised the Council for leaving Lakers closed for a whole year, and still not having any plans to reopen it. Shockingly, the Council have said there are no immediate plans to rebuild Lakers Youth Centre and that they are reviewing all youth services."

James Sanderson added, "The Council has insurance that should cover the damage done to Lakers by last year's fire, but has not disclosed how much money it has, or will, receive. The Lib Dems have challenged the Council to publicise how much funding it will get from the insurance and to reinvest that money to repair Lakers."

Lib Dems demand better for the NHS

Last year, the NHS celebrated its 70th birthday - but at no time in its existence has its future been more in doubt.

The number of cancelled operations is growing - whilst waiting times are on the increase. The Conservative Government are failing to give our doctors and nurses the support they need.

James Sanderson said, "We urgently need more resources for our NHS and only the Lib Dems are offering that right now."

The Lib Dems are calling for a new NHS and Social Care Tax. This would put just 1 penny on Income Tax - but raise billions of pounds that will go straight to the NHS to protect its future.

James Sanderson added, "The NHS is one of Britain's proudest achievements. We must act now to safeguard its future. Both the NHS and social care need money."

Paying more for less in Woking under the Tories

Local people have received their Council Tax bills with well above inflation rises - a Band D Council Tax bill is now £1,954.53.

Lib Dem Councillor Ann-Marie Barker and local campaigner James Sanderson have highlighted that Council Tax in Woking has gone up from £1,482 in 2009/10 to £1,954 today, an increase of 31.8%, despite the Conservatives cutting essential services.



The Lib Dems oppose people paying a third more in Council Tax for fewer services.

James Sanderson said, "It is appalling that Council Tax has gone up by over a third in a decade. I know many households in Goldsworth Park are already struggling with the cost of living and this latest hike will hit those on fixed incomes the hardest and be unaffordable for many."

Local Councillor Ann-Marie Barker added, "The Conservatives running Surrey County Council are cutting public services left, right and centre - from cuts to social care and libraries to closing 31 Children's Centres. Despite paying more Council Tax, we are getting fewer services."
